Fogg began producing Psychedelic Lightshows utilising Light Sculpture and Lumino Kinetic work in the 60s with many different musical genres, rock bands, classical, experimental, jazz and modern dance groups including work with composer Peter Sculthorpe and the Sydney and Melbourne Symphony Orchestras.

Fogg received two grants from the then Australian Council for the Arts for multimedia events. In those days the artists were in charge of the whole event as well as the set design, staging, lighting and lightshow, a tradition Fogg continues to this day. Having trained as both an artist and a production engineer he Production Manages all his own work.

Fogg's first gallery exhibition -WOOM- in collaboration with Vivienne Binns at Watters Gallery, Sydney in 1971, was critically acclaimed. Artist and writer James Gleeson described the multimedia environment as "the art of the future".

Fogg constructed the -Capsule Room- and later the -Laser Infinity Room- and assisted other artists with lighting projects in Sydney's The Yellow House 1971-3 and was described by noted arts writer Elwyn Lynn as one of only two Yellow House artists creating "new original work".

Fogg is also known for his work as a pioneering producer of large and small theatrical events featuring lumino kinetics - light sculpture - and lightshows. He devised, designed and directed the 10 day launch of The MIRAGE resorts in Queensland, 1988, his only brief was " make it all Australian".

And he devised the fairground style 'Australian Multicultural Show', an event style for visiting conventioneers that is still in use by the Event Industry today.

Fogg won a "Best Float" Award at the Sydney Gay and Lesbian Mardi Gras in 1989, an Entech Award for Architectural Theming for his work on modern special effects for Segaworld in 1997. And In 2014 he began using interactive technologies for the Darling Harbour Christmas Tree of LIGHT.

His Light Sculptures are often used as light sources for modern special events and art environments as well as being artwork in themselves.
